Museum Passes

Brewster Public Library offers a selection of free museum passes with support from the Friends of the Brewster Library and others. A list of currently held passes is available on the Library's website. In order to ensure fair and equitable access to these passes, the Library has established the following guidelines:

- Museum passes may be borrowed by Mid-Hudson Library System library cardholders who are 18 years of age or older. The library card must be valid for at least 30 days, and in good standing. (A library card in good standing is defined as one with no overdue items and no fines or fees exceeding \$10.00.)
- A pass may be reserved in advance by phoning or stopping by the library. Passes that are not currently reserved are available on a walk-in, first-come basis.
- The library reserves the right to limit museum passes to one at a time by a household.
- In order to borrow a museum pass, the patron's library card or other acceptable form of identification must be presented at the circulation desk. The museum pass will be checked out to the patron when a refundable deposit of \$10.00 is submitted.
- Museum passes may be borrowed for three (3) days. They may not be returned in the book drop, but must be returned in person to the circulation desk. Museum passes may not be renewed.
- An overdue fee of ten dollars (\$10.00) per day will be charged for each museum pass that is not returned by its due date.
- Borrowers who lose museum passes will be required to pay the full replacement cost, which may be up to \$500.
- The Library reserves the right to deny the use of museum passes to any borrower who repeatedly loses them or returns them late.
- Patrons should call the museum directly for information on hours of operation, special exhibits, additional fees, parking, and/or directions.

Exceptions:

Museum of Natural History - Patrons may receive 2 vouchers per year, per residence, which are good for free admission. These vouchers are limited to Town of Southeast residents. The vouchers do not need to be returned, and there is no deposit associated with them.

Mystic Aquarium and Norwalk Aquarium - These passes offer discounts, but not free admission. There are no deposits associated with these passes.
